## GENERAL ROUTE DESCRIPTION

There is a circular route around the site, approximately 600m (0.4 mile). The paths are hard surfaced but bumpy in places with some loose stones. All paths are over 1 m wide. After heavy rain or frost the stone path can become soft and sticky in places.

The route is either level or gently sloping.

For detailed information about the slopes and surfaces and to see if the paths are suitable for you please see the map overleaf. Only slopes with gradients over 1:25 and cross slopes over 1:33 are shown on the maps.



Opening times: The site is open at all times.

**Location:** Off the coast road just north of Chapel St Leonards

**Parking:** Both car park entrances have height barriers (1.95m /6' 4"). There are 5 disabled parking bays.

Accessible public toilets: On site (Easter to September only), Chapel Point and Chapel St Leonards.

**Refreshments:** Chapel St Leonards, Sandilands and Sutton on Sea.


















Chapel Six Marshes is a wetland area between the sea and the coast road. It lies within the Coastal Country Park and the Coastal Grazing Marshes.
